## Anti-Bullying Week



In a world where you can be anything... be kind.

A hate crime is when someone harms you or your property because of who you are.

This could be because of:


- a disability
- your race
- your religion
- your sexuality
- your gender identity



People also suffer for other reasons, such as their age, their gender or their lifestyle.

Hate crime may be when someone:

- bullies or frightens you
- damages your property
- takes your property
- calls you names
- hurts you



## What can you do?

There are lots of ways you can report hate crime against yourself or someone else

**Tell the police**

- Telephone the police on 101 anytime
- 999 in an emergency

You can trust them to listen to you and help

**Tell a staff member at a third party reporting centre**
