














## Welcome


#### **Maddie Moate**

In October we welcomed Scholastic Book Fair to our school. I don't think I have ever seen so many books!.



# **Reading Challenge Task**




We are very lucky to have so many wonderful libraries here in Liverpool, your reading challenge for this term is to;

- Take a photograph of yourself in or outside the library with the book you have chosen.






