RE – Monksdown Nursery 2021-2022

At Monksdown Nursery the teaching is always built on children's interests and enthusiasms as well as their learning and development needs. These PLODs (possible lines of development) help children to draw on their own experiences. We also recognise it is the adult role to introduce children to new experiences and learning opportunities.
