

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

DISNEY

WHAT ARE THE RISKS? The Walt Disney Company's streaming service, Disney+ combines entertoinment from the famous animation studio itself with Pisar, Star and National Geographic, plus the Marvel and Star Wars franchises. With occess to the latest releases, Disney classics and original series, there's plenty of content to explore. While parents may have noted that adverts have now been introduced an some versions of the service, the platform is – unsurprisingly for a Disney product – designed to be appropriate for the whole family.

LESS SUITABLE CONTENT

White Disney+ is predominantly family friendly, there are some movies and sheers in its library which are aimed at an older audience: these may some younger ones or contain themes or longuage that you'd rather your child wasn't exposed to, You could avoid such situations by enabling Junior Mode (see "Adjust content settings", below) or specifying a content age rating for your child's profile.

BINGE WATCHING

with the option to view content on only informet enobled device and a growing catalogue of movies, cortoons and documentaries, bisneys can make managing screen time difficult. This could result in children bings worldning content, distracting from inconscibilities like homework or sociations. Too much screen time has also been shown to negatively impact mood, sleep patterns and weight.

PHISHING EMAILS

Ee especially coutious if you receive emails or text messages purporting to be from bisney+. There have been numerous reports of online scommers impersonating Disneys staff in an attempt to gain access to subscribers' personal information. Disney+ states it will never email or coll customers asking for their payment details, their private information or their password.

ENCROACHING ADVERTS

Disney+has introduced a new subscription package – Disney+ Standard with Ads – which planys commercials hefore movies and during shows (like many TV channels). There are no adverts in Junior Mode, but profiles with a content roting of 8+ years will see ads appropriate for that age category. Adults who give consent will see personalised adverts based on their location and viewing history.

ACCESSING ADULTS' PROFILES

If adults don't set a PIN for their profile, children could occess it and encounter content which len't age oppropriate. In the settings, Junior Mede has a toggle titled 'Kid-Proof Esit' which requires the user to read four words (numbers, spelled ost) and enter them to switch profiles. For older children who can read, though, this lan't secure enough - so using a PIN for adult profiles is recommended.

Advice for Parents & Carers

ADJUST CONTENT SETTINGS

When setting up an account, there's an aption to create profiles in what's colled Junier Made. This generally covers material that's suitable for children up to age 6 and is therefore feitly limited. You can give older children a wider choice of viewing by building a standard profile, then going into the settings and choosing a content rating from one of the pre-set alternatives: \$+, \$+, \$12 \text{ or \$14+}.

TURN OFF AUTO-PLAY

When a cartoon, show or movie (mishes, Disney+ uses algorithms to identify content with similar themes, which it thinks your child will also enjoy. This suggestion will then automatically begin to play by default. There's an aprilon to turn off this auto-play function in the profile settings, which will encourage your child to take a break from the screen and move on to a different activity.

ADD PIN PROTECTION

Disneys enables you to effectively lock profiles behind a four-digit MR. In particular, some of the shows on the platform's. Stor content hub are for more oriented to adults (Including several bard-bitting dramas from UE networks), so protecting parents' or older sublings profiles with a PIN will help to prevent younger children stumbling across material which isn't intended for them.

ENJOY AS A FAMILY

When your child watches a movie or show on Disney+ for the first time, you may want to sit with them to ensure it's suitable. You could do the same when introducing them to older films that you haven't seen for years, your perception of what's oppropriate has very probably changed, and some of the language and attitudes in movies from your own childhood may seem quite shocking today.


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
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Electric Scooters

What is the law?

In the UK, whilst you can legally purchase an e-scooter, unless it is one of the orange Voi trial scooters, it remains illegal to ride one on the public highway/footway, or public parks, bridleways and byways. The only place you can legally use an e-scooter is on private land with the landowner's permission.

Why can't I use an e-scooter on the public highway?

The reason is that e-scooters are treated as Personal Light Electric Vehicles (PLEVs) by the Department of Transport and therefore:

- E-scooters are subject to the same legal requirement as other motor vehicles
- · You require an MOT, a driving licence, tax and insurance
- E-scooters would require number plates, signalling ability & visible rear lights

What about the orange Voi hire scooters?

Liverpool is currently taking part in Government trials for e-scooter hire. To use them you must:

- Be over 18 years of age
- · Hold a valid driving licence

What happens if I am caught?

The police can issue a warning to riders using an e-scooter illegally. However, depending upon the seriousness of the offence, officers also have the power to seize e-scooters and penalise the rider by issuing a:

- Fixed Penalty Notice for no insurance with a £300 fine and 6 penalty points
- Fixed Penalty Notice for no driving licence, up to a £100 fine and 3 to 6 penalty points

Other offences resulting in penalties include riding on the footpath, using a mobile phone, riding through red lights and drink drive offences.

Electric bikes

What is an Electric Bike (e-bike)?

An e-bike is a motor assisted pedal bike. They often look just like a conventional pedal cycle, but include a rechargeable battery and a motor, alleviating some of the pressure of pedalling. Once it reaches a top speed of 15.5mph, the motor cuts out and leaves the rest to the cyclist. This means that the cyclist can cycle faster than 15.5mph, but not with the help of the motor.

What is the law?

For an e-bike to be legal in the UK, it must:

- Come with a pedal-assist motor and have a max power output of 250 watts
- The electrical assistance must cut off when it reaches 15.5mph
- It cannot be ridden on the public highway by anyone under the age of 14

What if my e-bike exceeds 250 watts and has a motor independent of the pedals?

It is not illegal to own an e-bike exceeding 250 watts and with the motor independent of the pedals, however:

- . It is illegal to ride it as a standard bike or e-bike
- It needs to be registered, taxed, and insured as per a moped
- The rider must wear a helmet



- Do not charge e-bike or e-scooter batteries unsupervised, or whilst asleep
- If you do need to charge at home overnight, CLOSE all internal doors
- Make sure smoke alarms are fitted, working and tested regularly
- Damaged or broken battery packs must be replaced, don't use or charge them

Did you know?

If your child is absent from school for I week they would miss about 5 hours of Maths and 5 hours of English!

Our Approach to Attendance and Supportive Measures

According to legal requirements, schools must keep records of absences and the reasons for them. To ensure everything is in order, please reach out to us as soon as possible on the first day of your child's absence and provide a reason. The most convenient way to do this is through our StudyBugs App.

Remember, if no reason is given, it will result in an unauthorised absence mark for your child. We're here

 We believe in the importance of regular attendance and typically do not authorise absences without a valid reason

to assist you every step of the way!

- If we haven't received communication from you regarding your child's absence, you can expect a friendly phone call or text message from our team.
- Our attendance monitoring is diligent and if we notice any concerns with your child's attendance, we will reach out to you through a letter.
- In the event that attendance challenges persist, we'll kindly request a meeting with you to discuss how we can work together to support your child's attendance at school.
- If, despite our collective efforts, there is no
 improvement in attendance, we may need to involve the
 Education Welfare Officer (EWO) and this could
 potentially lead to legal action as a last resort. We aim to
 work collaboratively to prevent reaching this stage.

Please make sure your child arrives at school on time each day. Doors open at 8.50am ready for lessons to begin at 8.55 am.

Important Information about School Attendance

Thursday 7th September 2023

Dear Families of Monksdown,

Monksdown Primary School is determined to do everything they can to ensure your child has the very best start in life. An essential part of this is that every child is punctual and attends school. As a parent or carer, you have an important part to play. Your child has the right to a good education and you have a legal responsibility to ensure that they go to school on time, all of the time.

Pupils should only be absent from school if:

- They are too ill to attend
- They have a medical appointment that can't be arranged out of school hours
- There are exceptional circumstances
- Advanced permission has been granted from school

Leave of Absence during term time:

Parents/Carers do not have a right by law to take their child on holiday during school term-time.

Only in exceptional circumstances may school grant leave of absence for a holiday. A written application to the Head Teacher or myself, Chair of Governors, must be made in order for the school to consider this. If a parent/carer takes a child on holiday without prior permission from the school, the Local Authority may issue a **Penalty Notice of £120 per parent per child**, reduced to **£60 per parent per child** if paid within 21. days. Even if a leave of absence is permitted it still counts as an absence and is recorded as Unauthorised. Permission simply means a fixed penalty will not be issued.

If you are experiencing issues with your child's attendance the school's attendance team are there to support. Please contact the school should you require their help.
