


<u>Year 4 Learning Letter</u>

English



This half term we will be studying the book 'Blue John' by Berlie Doherty. At the end of the unit, we will be writing a letter in role as an expert containing an explanation about cave formation.

We will plan our writing by discussing the structure, vocab and grammar of similar writing; discuss and record ideas; compose and rehearse sentences orally; in non-narrative material, use simple organisational devices; assess the effectiveness of our own and others' writing and proof-read for spelling and punctuation errors.

Wider Curriculum in Year 4

Science - Teeth & Digestive System - We will look at the human digestive system along with the types of teeth compared to animals.

Geography - Contrasting European Region - We are learning about the Italian region of Campania. We will be looking at its physical and human geography and comparing it to the Lake District.

RE - Why do some people think that life is like a journey and what significant experiences mark this? - The children will learn about different religious and spiritual ways to mark milestones on the journey of life.

PSHE/RSE - The children will be learning about specific changes that occur to boys' and girls' bodies during puberty, and how babies grow. **DT** - The children will sample a range of cheese and breads to create their own version of cheese on toast.

Computing - Spreadsheets - The children will use a spreadsheet program to create art using cells.

PE - Athletics/Swimming - Classes 4.2 and 4.3 will continue with swimming until Friday 20th June. The children will work on running for both distance and speed along with throwing for distance using a range of techniques.
