

Your child's flu vaccination is now due

Dear Parent/ Guardian

This vaccination is recommended to help protect your child against flu. Flu can be an unpleasant illness and can cause serious complications. Vaccinating your child will also help protect more vulnerable family and friends by preventing the spread of flu.

Please complete your child's electronic consent form using the link sent to your email address or via text message to your mobile phone. Alternatively, you can contact the service using the telephone number provided below. If you have a paper consent form, please complete it and return it to the school within three days of receiving it.

If you do not wish your child to be vaccinated, please complete the consent form to decline. This will prevent further follow-up contact during this academic year.

Most children are offered a nasal spray vaccine which is a quick and painless spray up the nose. Please answer the questions on the consent form as a small number of children cannot have the nasal spray because of medical conditions or treatments. They can be offered protection through a vaccine injection instead.

The nasal spray vaccine is the preferred vaccine. It contains a very small amount of gelatine from pigs (porcine gelatine) as an essential ingredient to keep it stable and able to work. For those who may not accept medicines or vaccines that contain porcine gelatine, a flu vaccine injection is available.

Even if your child had the vaccine last year, the type of flu can vary each winter, so it is recommended to have it again this year or they won't be protected.

Since the programme was introduced, most children offered the vaccine in schools have had the immunisation.

It's important if after completing your child's form you attend the GP, Pharmacist or wish to amend their form you must contact the immunisation team directly and not your child's school.
