In Florence, on Easter Sunday Scoppio del Carro or 'Explosion of the Cart can be seen'. The cart or waggon is pulled through the city square by oxen followed by a concert of drummers and people dressed in historical costumes.



In Germany, trees are decorated with embellished Easter eggs. They are called Ostereierbaum or Easter Egg Trees.



In Poland, on Saturday before Easter Sunday, people bless food in baskets. They share this food during Easter Sunday breakfast.



In Spain, Easter can be very different from how you might be used to celebrating it at home. There are no Easter egg hunts or giant bunnies. Here, it's more about the religious side of the festival, filled with masses, processions and religious floats.
