
What is chronology?

- Also, you can find out more about your family before you were born.


This shows my timeline from when I was born up to the present day - now. I used base 10 blocks to help me but you can draw lines on paper.


As you can see this is quite boring!

On this one I have added my mum and dad and we then go further back in time.




As you can see we are now as far back as the 1930s. And you can see clearly where my life overlaps with the lives of my parents.




Now I have started to add events that happened during our life times. I have marked World War 2 (1939-1945) that both my parents lived through. I remember them telling me of their experiences.


1947 - The birth of the NHS


A vertical line is drawn at the year 1960. Below the vertical line, 'JFK' is written.
