

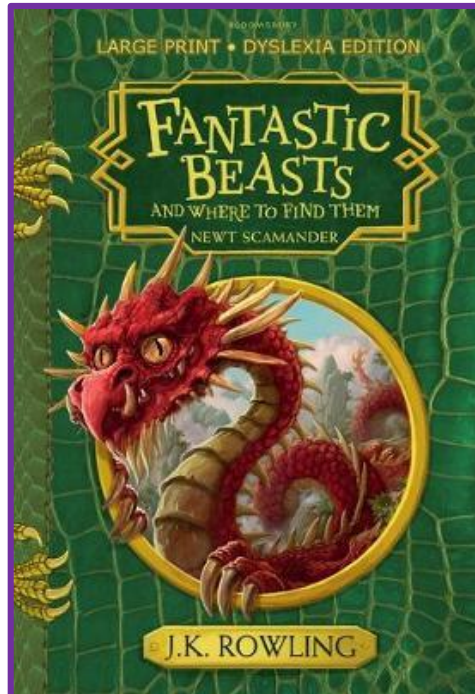

You might need to do some research – remember what you've been taught about e-safety.

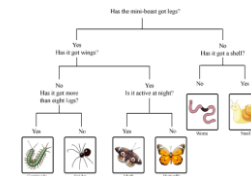
